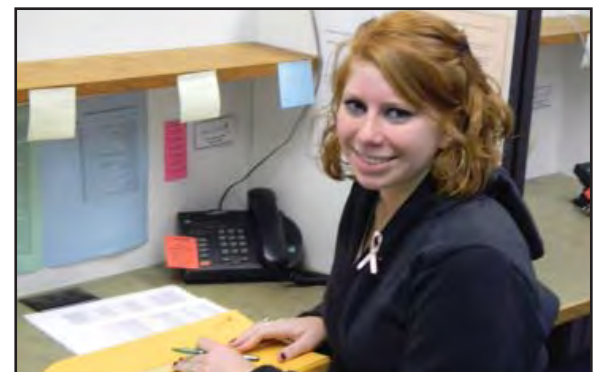

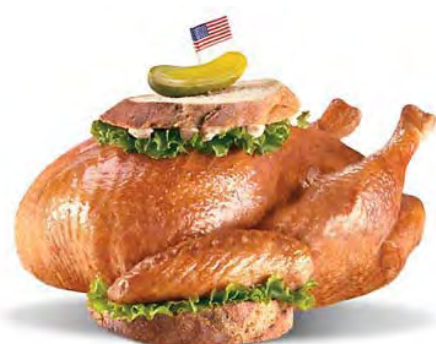
Do's and Don'ts Freshmen Edition

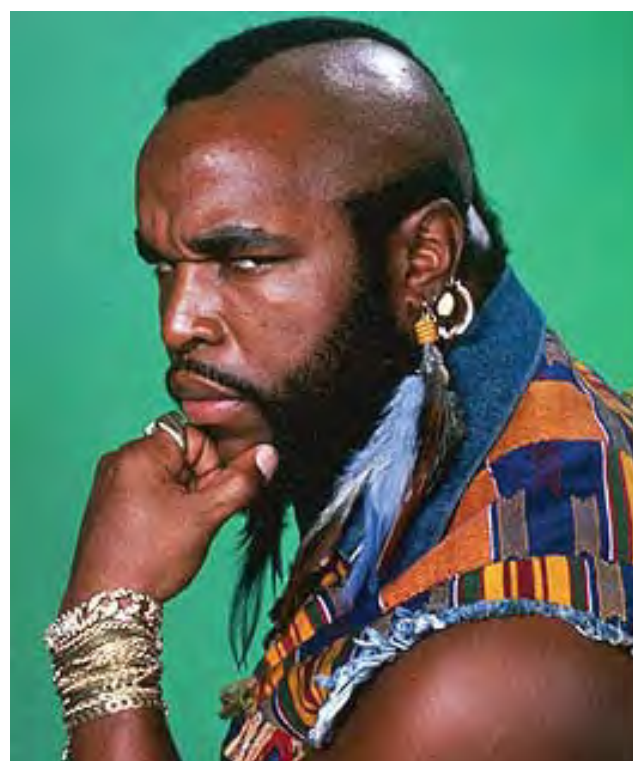

MAJOR UPDATES

TECHNOLOGY COMPLEX ENERGIZED BY THE SUN New Solar Panels Offer Learning Component in Addition to Savings

Through a \$172,000 grant from the New York

State Energy Research and Development Authority (NYSERDA) SUNY Delhi installed a



State Energy Research and Development Authority (NYSERDA) SUNY Delhi installed a system of solar electric modules this summer to provide a permanent site for demonstrating renewable energy technology to students preparing for careers in electrical and building construction while offsetting a portion on the college's energy use.

"This project is an example of how Delhi is ex-

panding its leadership in photovoltaic energy," said President Candace S. Vancko. "We are taking steps to provide new learning opportunities for students while conserving resources." Delhi is one of only three institutions in New York State that offer nationally-accredited photovoltaic programs.

The installation involves 100 solar panels mounted on poles adjacent to the college's Electrical Technologies Center. The proximity to Electrical Technology classrooms will provide an

ongoing learning experience for Delhi students and for participants in the college's accredited photovoltaic workshops. Two additional solar modules will be installed exclusively for a laboratory where students will learn how to set up and break down a solar electric system.

The modules will produce 22.4 kilowatts of energy collected through the solar panels and will

offset up to 25 percent of the annual electric usage for the Electrical Technologies Center.

SUNY Delhi is accredited by the Interstate Renewable Energy Council, with assistance from the New York State Energy Research and Development Authority (NYSERDA), for teaching the design and installation of solar electric systems as part of its Electrical Construction and Instrumentation curriculum. Delhi also offers photovoltaic training courses as a public service, the last of which was held in early August. Computer Aided Drafting and Design Majors Score 100% Pass Rate on National Exam

Every 2011 freshman in SUNY Delhi's [Computer Aided Drafting and Design program](#) who took the Certified Drafter National Exam achieved a 100 percent pass rate. This is the second consecutive year that SUNY Delhi students have achieved a perfect pass rate on the exam, which is administered through the [American Design Drafting Association \(ADDA\)](#).

A total of 14 Delhi students earned the distinction of ADDA Certified Drafters. The examination is administered each year at SUNY Delhi through the college's student ADDA chapter, giving Delhi graduates the opportunity to take the exam without traveling.

"Passing this certification test is a major advantage for our students who are seeking summer jobs or internships in the field. It proves that they have met a national standard in mechani-

cal drafting," said Distinguished Professor Joseph Greenfield, Computer Aided Drafting and Design at SUNY Delhi. "It also gives the faculty a positive indicator that students have met their first year learning outcomes and are fully prepared to progress on to their second year."

The ADDA Drafter Certification Examination is open to all individuals, regardless of experience and formal education. Certification enables drafters to demonstrate professional capabilities and helps employers in identifying quality employees.

SUNY Delhi's Computer Aided Drafting and Design program prepares graduates for employment as a designer/drafter or serves as a stepping stone to other technical and managerial positions. Graduates may also transfer to

a four-year bachelor's degree program in one of the engineering technologies or to a bachelor's degree program in industrial or technical education in preparation for a career as a technical teacher in public schools.

What's THAT?

Bronco Bucks are additional funds that are attached to your meal plan and can only be used for food. So if you use up all your meals for the week, you can still eat!

Delhi Dollars is money that you or your family can put on your account so your SUNY Delhi ID will kind of work like a gift card that you can use on campus and at various restaurants so you don't have to carry cash. On campus you can use them at MacDonald Dining Center, Campus Book Store, Campus Convenience, Library Café, Farrell Commons, Treat Street, at the ID Office for replacement ID's and in the vending machines. In Delhi at Café on the Green, Haggerty Ace Hardware, Pizza Hut, Subway, and McDonalds. In Oneonta at Brooks House of Bar-B-Q, Dominos Pizza, and Applebee's. **Delhi Dollars cannot be used for tips so remember to tip your waitresses.**



1. You can change your MEAL PLAN but only up to the 10th day of classes. This is **September 9th** so don't procrastinate; make the changes now before it's too late.
2. If you already have health insurance you can waive the college's health insurance plan. This deadline is September 30th. Go to <https://studentcenter.uhcsr.com/delhi> and follow the directions to make the change. You'll need your insurance card so have that handy. This will save you hundreds of dollars so if you have coverage on your own, you will want to take care of this asap.
3. It's a good idea to sign up for Manage My ID at <https://delhi.managemyid.com>. You'll be able to track your meal plan and see how many Bronco bucks you have left. From here you can also find out how to open a Delhi Dollars account and add more Bronco bucks.
4. If you ever have any questions about anything, please feel free to stop by the CADI offices next to the book store on the top floor of the Farrell Student & Community Center.

The past few years have proven to be very exciting for America's Band, RECYCLED PERCUSSION, since their highly successful run on "America's Got Talent". Their success and the

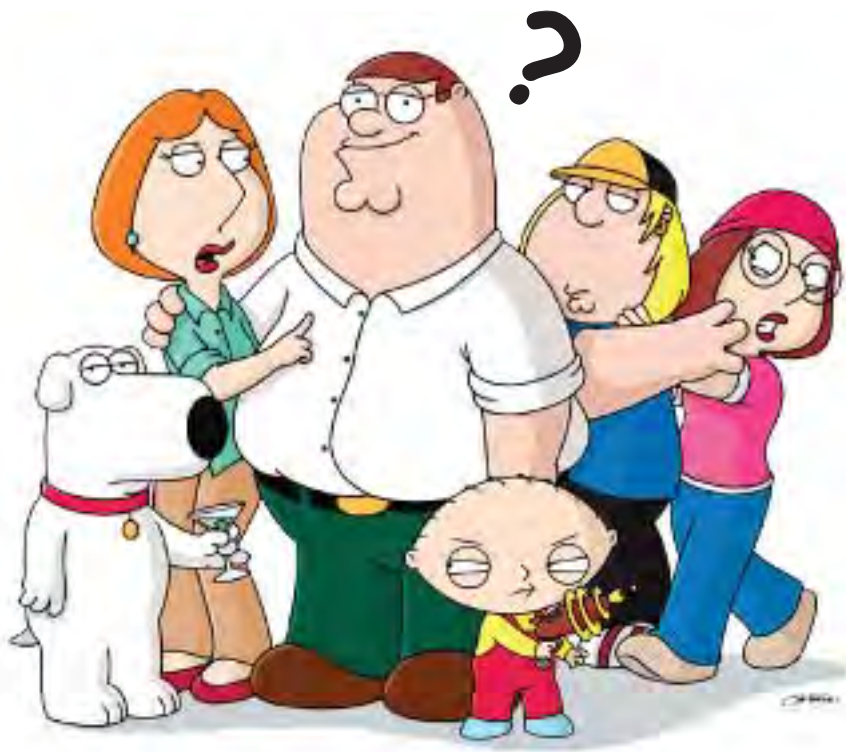

holders and to prevent copyright infringement. Copyright infringement is the copying, redistribution or downloading of software, music, videos or games without the copyright holders expressed permission to do so. In terms of file sharing, this includes downloading or uploading substantial parts of a copyrighted work without authority to do so or having acquired the copyrighted material in a legal way (purchasing the item for individual use only). In addition, it is a violation to possess or acquire illegal copies. Students must be careful of the content on Peer-to-Peer (P2P) file sharing programs as it is unlikely to be shared by the copyright holder.

The Digital Millennium Copyright Act (DMCA) of 1998 was signed into law to protect the rights of

copyright

In the last decade, the Recording Industry Association of America (RIAA) began addressing violations of the Digital Millennium Copyright Act and a number of civil suits were brought against college students at various institutions costing them thousands of dollars.

SUNY Delhi must adhere to the provisions outlined in the Digital Millennium Copyright Act (DMCA) and cannot encourage, permit or condone the illegal sharing of copyrighted materials. The College does not allow students to use its network resources to illegally share software, music, video and games.

The Judicial Affairs Office, along with the Computer Information Systems Office would like to remind students that penalties for copyright infringement include civil and criminal penalties. In general, anyone found liable for civil copyright infringement may be ordered to pay either actual damages or “statutory” damages of no less than \$50 and not more than \$30,000 per work infringed. For “willful” infringement, a court

may award up to \$150,000 per work infringed. A court can, in its discretion, also assess costs and attorneys’ fees. Willful copyright infringement can also result in criminal penalties, including imprisonment of up to five years and fines of up to \$250,000 per offense.

In addition to the federal civil and criminal penalties associated with copyright infringement, violators can also face suspension of campus computer access privileges and campus judicial sanctions. What is a Co-Curricular Transcript (CCT)?

A Co-Curricular Transcript is an official Record of your co-curricular activities (clubs, organizations, activities, and community service), awards, accomplishments, and honors received during your time at SUNY Delhi

What is a Co-Curricular Transcript Used For?

As an official college document, the CCT can be used to support your search for summer employment, internships, graduate school, or a job after you graduate. The CCT is also required for many scholarships and awards SUNY Delhi offers its students. Official copies of the CCT may accompany your resume or scholarship application, employment, college

transfer or graduate school. In a recent survey, 71% of employers preferred job applicants to include a co-curricular transcript

How Do I Start a CCT?

Each semester several workshops are offered to help you get your CCT started. Check the Student Activities Calendar to find out when!
