******Important Information******

Registration opens April 21, 2014 for high school students. Registration forms may be sent prior to April 21, 2014 and will be processed in the order received. Registrations will be accepted through May 19th for “A” session and through July 7th for “B” session.

College in High School students may not exceed more than 11 credits within both summer sessions.

The high school rate is available to local sophomores, juniors, and seniors with a “B” or “83” average or higher (***please note seniors are eligible for the discounted high school rate during “A” session only***). You must have your guidance counselor complete the GPA information on the registration form.
