Registration opens April 20, 2015 for high school students. Registration forms may be sent prior to April 20, 2015 and will be processed in the order received. Registrations will be accepted through May 25th for "A" session and through July 13th for "B" session. College in High School students may not exceed more than 11 credits within both summer sessions. The high school rate is available to local sophomores, juniors, and seniors with a "B" or "83"average or higher. You must have your guidance counselor complete the GPA information on the registration form.
